### *End the Blockade of Gaza – 11 February*

Although a ceasefire has now been imposed in Gaza, Israel's blockade of the Gaza Strip – an act of war – continues unabated, preventing the entry of vital resources for reconstruction and desperately-needed humanitarian aid.

An international campaign has formed to demand that Israel end its blockade and let the people of Gaza live. Join the Emergency Gaza Coalition in a demonstration making this demand at 4:30 pm on Wednesday, 11 February, outside the JFK Federal Building in downtown Boston. ### *March on Wall Street – 4 April*

United for Peace and Justice (UfPJ) has announced a campaign challenging both imperialism abroad and economic injustice at home. In actions throughout the spring, we will highlight the connections between militarism, racism, and poverty.

UfPJ's "Yes We Can" campaign will culminate with a march on Wall Street on 4 April, the anniversary of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s famous "Beyond Vietnam" speech, as well as his assassination exactly one year later.

March 2009 will mark six years of war and occupation in Iraq. As the new administration puts into motion its plans to escalate the war in Afghanistan, and possibly expand it further into Pakistan, the antiwar movement will march on the Pentagon to demand that all the troops be brought home now.

More than 1,000 organizations and individuals have already joined together to start forming a March 21 National Coalition that will bring people from all walks of life and from all cities across the United States to take part in the demonstration.

### *Massachusetts State Convention – 15 Feb.*

The **2009 State Convention** of the Socialist Party of Massachusetts (SPMA) will be held in **Cambridge** on **Sunday, 15 February**, beginning at **1 pm**. Our annual state conventions are the highest decision-making body of the SPMA, with the power to charter new locals, initiate statewide projects and campaigns, amend our constitution, and elect a State Executive Committee to manage the day-to-day operations.

This year's convention comes at an exciting time, as the end of the Bush regime and the new administration present Socialists with both new challenges and new opportunities. The ongoing economic collapse makes it all the more urgent for us to build momentum behind socialist solutions to our current problems, introduce democratic socialism to new constituencies, and re-energize our movement for a more just and equitable society.

The convention will take place in the American Friends Service Committee (AFSC) building in Cambridge. The AFSC building is wheelchair accessible and is located at **2161 Massachusetts Ave.**, between the Davis Square and Porter Square T stations on the Red Line. There is plenty of on-street parking nearby.

We will get underway at 1 pm, with some time for refreshments and socializing before-hand. The meeting will bring together socialists from across the state, including our two organized locals in the Boston area and the Pioneer Valley, to work on statewide projects, campaigns, and organization.

The convention will focus special attention on organizing new locals, and helping those in unorganized regions get more actively involved in the Socialist Party.
